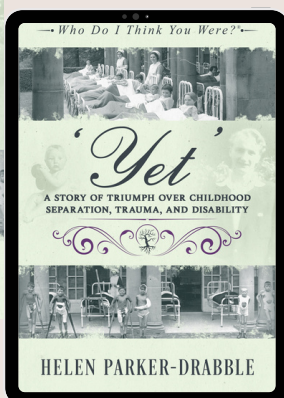
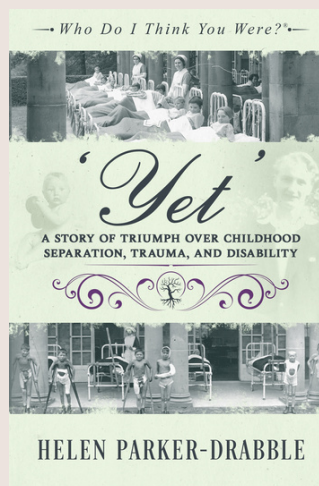


'YET': A STORY OF TRIUMPH OVER CHILDHOOD SEPARATION, TRAUMA, AND DISABILITY
